

The **Network for Regional Healthcare Improvement (NRHI)** was founded in 2004 to share learnings among six leading regional collaboratives: Pacific Business Group on Health/California Cooperative Healthcare Reporting Initiative, Massachusetts Health Quality Partners, Pittsburgh Regional Health Initiative, Institute for Clinical Systems Improvement, Minnesota Community Measurement, and the Wisconsin Collaborative for Healthcare Quality. **NRHI's mission is to accelerate improvement in the value (quality and cost) of healthcare delivery in the United States, by building and strengthening regional, multi-stakeholder coalitions and influencing national policy for regional coalitions.**

The NRHI Peer Learning Group is the home for all regional health organizations to learn and share and to leverage our collective expertise and experience for accelerating healthcare improvement nationally.

The NRHI Peer Learning Group provides:

- Practical, results-focused learning for regional health coalition leaders to share with each other, and outside experts, tools, skills, lessons learned and best practices; and
- A unified, collective voice for regional health initiatives with federal government, philanthropic organizations, and national quality stakeholders.

NRHI Peer Learning Group Benefits

Benefits of the NRHI Peer Learning Group include the opportunity to participate and learn from:

1. Monthly Webex Calls to share knowledge and dialogue with national and regional stakeholders on healthcare;
2. An email listserve of regional health coalition members;
3. Periodic email updates on regional quality activities
4. Annual face to face meetings on leading edge issues, such as payment reform; and
5. A collective voice to national organizations (federal government, private foundations, quality oversight and coordinating bodies) on the needs and contributions of regional health coalitions in transforming healthcare.

NRHI Peer Learning Group Membership Criteria

Organizations interested in participating in the NRHI Peer Learning Group must be committed to open sharing within the NRHI Peer Learning Group and must meet at least one of the following criteria:

1. Chartered as a Value Exchange (CVE) by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality; or
2. Selected as a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Aligning Forces for Quality (AFQ) site; or
3. Selected as a Better Quality Information (BQI) site by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services; or
4. Is a regional health organization that:
 - A. Is a not-for-profit organization, and
 - B. Is governed by a multi-stakeholder Board; and
 - C. Has a strategic and operational focus on regional healthcare improvement that includes either:
 - i. Education and Training,
 - ii. Public Reporting,
 - iii. Technical Assistance,
 - iv. Health Information Exchange,
 - v. Patient Safety, or
 - vi. Value-based Purchasing.

The annual membership fees are \$4,500. Membership in the NRHI Peer Learning Group is limited to 30 organizations.
