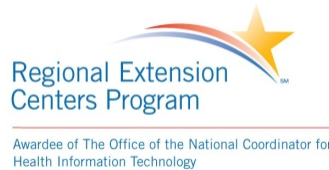


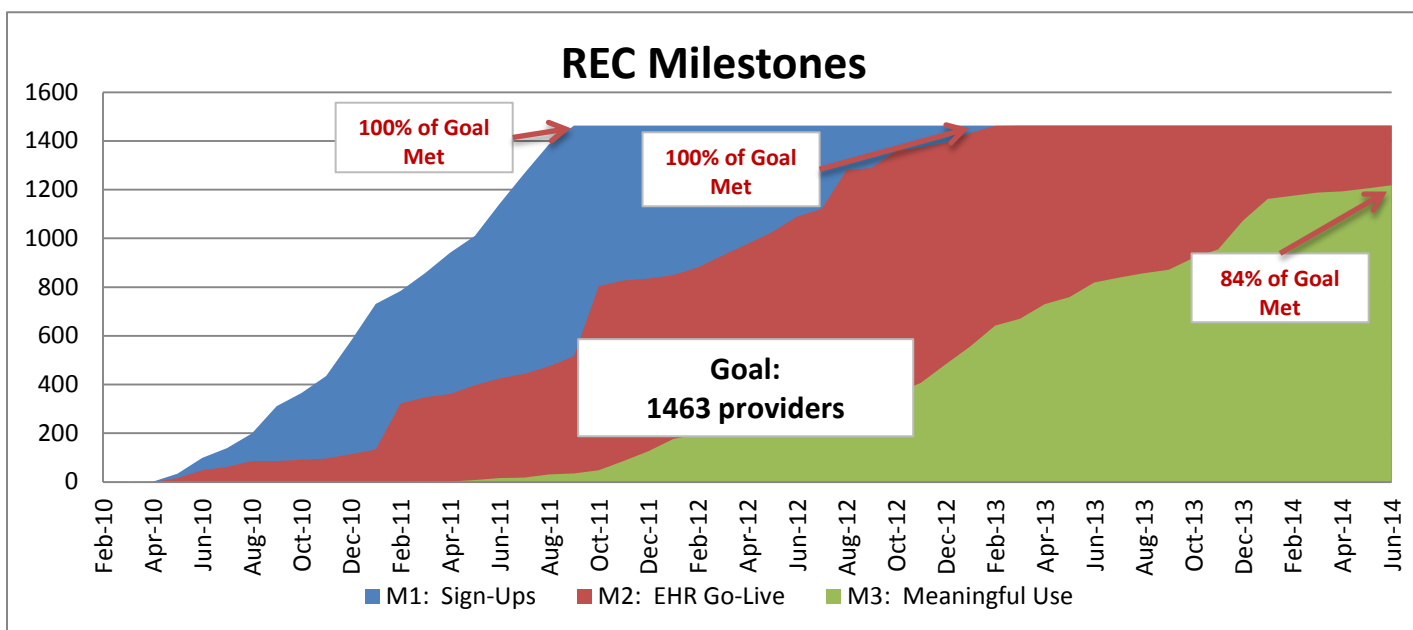
# HealthInsight REC Program Performance Report for Nevada and Utah – June 2014



The *HealthInsight* Regional Extension Center (REC) efforts have significantly impacted the adoption of electronic (EHR) technology and Meaningful Use in Nevada and Utah. *HealthInsight* has successfully supported more than the targeted 1463 priority primary care providers (PPCPs) through the sign-up and go-Live milestones of the program, with over 1,000 providers having met meaningful use requirements for the first 90-day reporting period for Stage 1. Additionally, the hospital supplemental funding has allowed us to support 30 critical access hospitals (CAHs) and rural hospitals (RHs), and their affiliated providers, in the underserved, rural parts of our states.
